Dear Mentor,

Years ago, when I was incarcerated and approaching my parole hearing, I had hopes that I could go home to my family. Why should they keep me there? I had done everything that was asked of me, I did the best I could each day, and I had taken great pains to reflect on who I was and where I was going. During my incarceration, I spent a lot of time discovering who Jesus wanted me to be. He often revealed Himself through the words of my family and church members on the outside and through the support of the men attending our facility's church.

I had already put my family and many others through so much pain, so when the parole board responded with a denial, I was shattered. How would I share this devastating news with my wife, Hendrina?

"Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything" (James 1:2-4).

All of us have faced or will face trials that threaten to overwhelm us and test our faith. During these seasons, God can seem distant, unforgiving, or not in control of our circumstances. As a mentor, you will likely hear from students who are struggling to see how God is working in their circumstances. You may hear from a student that their judge seemed unfair and did not take the whole story into consideration, or you may be told that a student's appeal against their sentencing failed. Tragically, you may be told that a student's parent or child has died. Or, as I told my mentor, you may hear that a student's parole was denied. When our faith is tested by things out of our control, it can be easy to listen to Satan's lies (John 8:44).

Rarely do we feel like we have the perfect answer or solution for our students' specific circumstances, however unfair or difficult they may be. Yet we do have promises we can share: God will strengthen us and help us (Isaiah 41:10). In Jesus, we have peace (John 16:33). God will give us rest (Matthew 11:28-29). Through our trials, we must find the strength to persevere. Scripture can offer comfort and hope, helping us stand firm in Him even if the circumstances seem insurmountable (1 Peter 5:6-10).

I always try to remind myself of the simple phrase, "God's got it." While my circumstances may not make sense and may hurt terribly, I know that He has it, whatever "it" is. Our responsibility when we face trials is to trust God and persevere. Through this, we honor ourselves, we honor those we love, and, most of all, we honor God.

Even though I had read James 1:2-4 many times, there was no joy to be found when I called Hendrina to let her know that I would not be released. My heart broke as I shared the news. In the days that followed, I struggled not to become angry. However, in the years after my release, when I reflected on that season, I found many gifts within the heartache I experienced.

As I anticipate the next time my faith is tested, I pray I hold on to the truth that "God's got it." Encourage your students to do the same.

Course Designed for Students in Jail

Because the average stay in jail is twenty-one days, many students that enroll from jail only have time to complete one Crossroads lesson. Recently, we created a new version of our course *Who Are You?* by reformatting it into a single booklet called *The Three Big Questions*, and we tested it with students in jail. During this pilot test, the number of students in jail who were able to complete the course more than doubled. As 30 percent of new Crossroads students enroll from a jail facility, this is a significant new initiative. We are expecting to make the new course available this fall.

Collective Scripture Reading and Prayer

We have received positive feedback from many of our students about the Scripture reading and prayer guide included in each *Just for Students* newsletter. We are inviting mentors and Crossroads staff to read and pray along with them. You will find a copy of the September–October guide enclosed.

In September and October, we will be reading through the Gospel of John together. Each Gospel was written for a specific audience. John's Gospel was written to tell the story of Jesus to Gentiles, or non-Jewish believers, who might not have understood all of Matthew's references to Jesus as the promised Messiah of the Jewish people. John introduced Jesus as the "Word" who had come to earth in the flesh. The Greek word *logos*, translated as "the Word," was familiar to the Greek philosophers of Jesus' time. *Logos* was understood by the Greeks to be the intelligence behind the creation of the universe. John shared with his readers that the *logos*, or intelligence, responsible for creating the universe was Jesus.
