PRESIDENT

Approximately 2 million men and women are incarcerated in the U.S. and over 10 million around the world. Crossroads Prison Ministries was born out of a desire to connect Christians on the 'outside' with those in prison—to offer the hope of the Gospel from someone who cares. I am inspired every day by the transformative testimonies of men and women. Men and women who return to society stronger in their faith are less likely to return to prison and are positioned to be better spouses, parents, and overall members of society. We believe their spiritual development is an important component of this transformation and for 40 years Crossroads has been committed to this mission. While our mission remains the same, 2024 has been a year of significant change at Crossroads. I am excited about the progress we have made in critical areas:

- We have translated more lessons into more languages than in any other single year in our history.
- International in-country printing of lessons continues to expand. This is giving our international leaders more control of lesson supply, supporting local economies, and reducing shipping costs and delays.
- Both in the United States and internationally, we are strengthening our relationships with more Bible-centered churches.

- Crossroads provides Bibles to any student who requests one. In the 2023-2024 fiscal year, we mailed almost 10,000 Bibles, nearly 200 per week, to ensure students had access to God's Word.
- Finally, we are working hard to elevate the level of our communication so that more people can join with us by providing prayers, mentorship, or financial support.

I am overwhelmed with and grateful for your faithful support. I hope you are inspired by the impact you've already helped us achieve and I trust you will be encouraged by a few of the stories in this year's report.

Crossroads Prison Ministries has established an ambitious goal of reaching an enrollment of 70,000 students annually by 2029. This will more than double our current annual enrollments. While we continue to make progress, there is still much work to be done.

With your help, we can continue to bring the hope of the Gospel and encouraging mentors to incarcerated men and women around the world.

WHERE HOPE UNFOLDS

Crossroads Prison Ministries is the bridge between the church and those in prison, growing relationships of faith in the most unlikely of places both at home and abroad.

UNITED STATES

- 27,518 students in the United States participated in the Crossroads program (completed at least one lesson).
- 18,816 courses were completed by students.
- 139,089 Bible study lessons were sent to students in the United States.
- 110,943 lessons were completed by students.
- 2,514 mentors journeyed with those students through God's Word.
- 9,833 Bibles were sent to people in prison at no cost to them, providing a personal copy of God's Word for them to study.
- An estimated 177,370 hours of work were donated by Crossroads volunteers (mentors and office volunteers); equivalent to 90 full-time staff.
- 32 ambassadors worked to spread the word about this ministry throughout the United States.
- The Crossroads program reached students in 1,678 facilities in the United States:
 - 912 state prisons
 - 131 federal correctional facilities
 - 493 jails
 - 142 other facilities

INTERNATIONAL MINISTRY

- At the close of the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the Crossroads program was operating in 24 countries.
- 10,952 students participated in the Crossroads program (completed at least one lesson).
- 2,662 mentors journeyed with those students through God's Word.
- 16,783 lessons were shipped to extension centers.
- An additional 84,110 lessons were printed in-region.
- 3,511 Bibles were distributed.

Bahasa Indonesia.

- This past year, Crossroads international partners reported raising over \$200K (USD) to support their work.
- Before this year, Crossroads introductory course, Who Are You?, had been translated for international use into six languages. As of the end of this past fiscal year, Crossroads has three courses (a total of 11 lessons) available for international use in 10 languages: English, Spanish, Kiswahili, French, Nepali, Thai, Mandarin, Sinhala, Tagalog, and

- During FY24, postage for all student lessons and correspondence cost \$440,984.
- Additionally, Crossroads mentors spent at least \$102,067.56 on postage to return lessons to their students.
- This past year, a 2-ounce stamp cost \$0.92, and a 3-ounce

CHALLENGES

FACING CROSSROADS IN 2024 AND 2025

Rising costs and mail restrictions in prisons are making it more difficult to accomplish our mission to connect people in prison with mentors from churches to study God's Word together and establish Christ-centered relationships. In addition, the cost of postage to ship lessons in the U.S. and internationally continues to increase. Even though we have employed strategies such as in-country printing around the world and streamlining printing-ondemand processes to reduce costs, postage costs remain our largest expense second only to staffing costs.

- Cost of annual postage: \$450,000
- Cost of providing Bibles to any student in the U.S. and internationally who requests one: \$100,000
- Cost of Spread the Word enrollment cards and digital enrollment campaigns on tablets and postage: \$100,000

Refer a Student: If you know someone in prison who would like to connect with a Christian mentor, please refer them to our program.


Become a Mentor: Show compassion, use your gifts, and make an eternal difference in someone's life without ever having to leave home.
