Growing in Wisdom

The apostle Paul wrote:

"When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known." (1 Corinthians 13:11-12)

As summer plants and crops grow, let this season be a time for you to grow in wisdom too. Money, fame, and power can disappear at any time, but no one can take away the wisdom that God gives through His Word.

A Message from Crossroads' President, Joe Pryor

The choices we make have a big impact on our lives. Whom we spend time with, how we treat others, and how we care for ourselves all shape our futures. But every choice needs to be built on a strong foundation.

Joshua gives us an example of an important choice that shapes all others. In Joshua 24:15, he says:

"But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your ancestors served beyond the Euphrates, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

Joshua made it clear—we all have to choose. Will you follow the false gods of this world, or will you serve the one true God who loves you and offers eternal life through Jesus? The choice is yours.

New Curriculum Course Sequence

For some time, we've been talking about new courses coming soon. Changes in our budget, staffing, and prison mail rules caused some delays. But we're excited to share that **the new curriculum officially launches in English on July 1!** A full timeline for Spanish-language courses will be announced at a later date. Until then, Spanish-language students will continue in their current courses.

If you are a current student, you can finish the course you are working on. Once you finish, you will move into the new course sequence at the right place in the sequence. If you've already completed Survey of the Bible or God's Story of Redemption, you will not be able to retake the updated version, now called God's Great Story.

Core Program (Tier 1)

The Core Program helps students understand the key truths of the Christian faith.

- Who Are You? (3 lessons) Explores life's big questions: Who am I? Why am I here? Where am I going? (Jail students will take a shorter, single-lesson version called **Three Big Questions**.)
- Who Is Jesus? (4 lessons) Teaches about the life and teachings of Jesus.

- What Is the Bible? (4 lessons) Helps students understand how to read and study the Bible.
- **Truths of the Faith** (8 lessons) Covers key teachings and beliefs of the Christian faith. (Updated from *Great Truths* of the Bible.)

After completing the Core Program, students can:

- 1. Receive a certificate and choose not to continue.
- 2. If the student has 18 months or less until release, they can take **Returning Home** (6 lessons), a course focused on preparing for reentry.
- 3. Continue with the Growth Program (Tier 2) and one-on-one mentoring by completing What Is a Mentor? (3 lessons).

Until this point, students will have a different mentor for each lesson.

Growth Program (Tier 2)

The Growth Program helps students grow spiritually and understand the Bible better. In the Growth Program, students are paired with one mentor who will review each lesson.

- A Renewed Mind (4 lessons) Helps students address sin and negative thinking.
- Sermon on the Mount (5 lessons) Focuses on Jesus' teachings from Matthew 5-7.
- God's Great Story (8 lessons) Tells the story of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. (Updated from Survey of the Bible.)
- The Church Inside the Fence (4 lessons) Explains how to serve God while in prison.

Advanced Program (Tier 3)

The Advanced Program is for deeper study and leadership development. Placement in the Advanced Program requires a mentor recommendation.

- Biblical Interpretation (12 lessons) Teaches how to study and understand the Bible.
- Biblical Truths in Depth (10 lessons) Explains the key teachings of Christian theology.

Jail Program

We now have a special program for students in jail. Most people stay in jail for about 21 days, so we created a shorter program to help them start learning quickly.

Jail students will begin with *The Three Big Questions*—a shorter version of *Who Are You?*—designed to be completed before transfer or release. Students who stay in jail for at least three months will then continue with the full Core Program.

Reentry Course

Preparing for returning home from prison is the key to staying out for life. Crossroads is committed to helping people during this critical life transition. For students who complete the Core Program, and are within 18 months of going home, the course Returning Home provides a roadmap for release planning. Placing God first in their reentry planning gives the Crossroads student strategies for continued spiritual growth and personal success after release from incarceration.

Spread the Word

Most new Crossroads students hear about us because current students like you share the program with others. This is important because it means this is your ministry. While Crossroads staff and volunteers are here to support you, you are the ones helping to spread the Gospel.

Jesus told a story about a rich man who gave money to his servants while he was away. When he returned, two of the servants had used the money wisely and increased its value. The man said to them:

"Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!"

God has given you something even greater than money—a relationship with Him. As a follower of Jesus, you have received the greatest gift: eternal life and a relationship with your heavenly Father.

In this issue of *Just for Students*, you were sent extra Spread the Word cards to share with others at your facility (if your facility allows them). God has placed you where you are for a reason. You are part of His plan. We pray that God will use you to build His kingdom.

We continue to be amazed and thankful for each of you who have committed to following Jesus.

Scripture Reading and Prayer Guide: The Wisdom of Proverbs

The book of Proverbs, written primarily by King Solomon, offers wisdom for living a godly life. Many of its sayings may sound familiar. When God told Solomon He would give him anything he wanted, Solomon asked for wisdom. By applying the teachings of Proverbs to our daily lives, we can grow in our relationships and improve in all we do.

Proverbs Trivia

How many of these did you know?

- Solomon wrote most of the book of Proverbs.
- King Solomon's reign was the most prosperous time in Israel's history.
- Proverbs is written as Hebrew poetry, which pairs two lines together—the second line usually complements or contrasts the first line.
- The first seven verses of Proverbs explain that the purpose of the book is to give God's people wisdom.
- Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Job are part of the Old Testament's wisdom literature.
- Proverbs describes wisdom as "Lady Wisdom."
- The term "wisdom" in Proverbs can be translated as "skill in the art of godly living."
- Proverbs 31, which describes the virtuous woman, is written as an acrostic using the Hebrew alphabet (each verse begins with a different letter of the Hebrew alphabet).

- **Return address reminder.** Please do not write the lesson ID number on your return address when you mail back completed lessons.
- Include every page. When you return a completed lesson, make sure to send back every page of the lesson.
