
Now we're inviting you to put that faith into action by helping us reach more students. You have a special opportunity to encourage those around you who may need hope and truth in their lives.

So send me to the mountaintop or the valley low; for any way You point Your light will be the way I go.



Verses to Read and Remember

Here are six Bible verses to help you focus on the true meaning of Christmas. Try memorizing one each week. Think about it and pray over it every day.

1. Isaiah 7:14	"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel."
2. Micah 5:2	"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."
3. Isaiah 9:6	"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."
4. Matthew 1:2	"She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

6. Luke 2:11	"Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord."

Here are a few reminders about your lessons and mail:

- Send back all pages of your lesson. This helps us process it faster and send your next lesson sooner.
- **Moving or going home?** If you're transferring to a new facility or getting released and want to keep doing lessons, let us know. If you're going home, wait until you get there to send us your new address.
- Some lessons are sent to a mail service. For students at certain facilities, we must send lessons to a mail service instead of directly to the facility. In some cases, new lessons will go to your facility while reviewed lessons will go to the mail service. Please know that we understand the value of receiving a physical copy of the lesson in a timely manner. However, at times this process is the only way for you to receive the mentor's letter along with the lesson.
